Stormwater Relief Coming Soon to Gardens Neighborhood

The Crestwood Gardens neighborhood south of 135th Street and east of the Rubio Woods Forest Preserve will get much-needed planned relief from decades-old flooding that can plague the neighborhood in large rainfall events. Two important storm sewer projects are underway in the area to mitigate street and basement flooding.

The first is a large-scale project conducted by the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) started in 2022. This \$9 million project will carry stormwater from overland flow from the Cook County Forest Preserves at 135th Street and Central Avenue into a large 72-inch sewer pipe along 135th Street into the Laramie Avenue ditch, next to the Nathan Hale Schools. The water will then flow in the ditch to an outflow at the Cal-Sag Channel. The ability to carry larger

volumes of water at greater velocity will be a major boost to keeping water from flowing into the Gardens neighborhood, according to the Village and the MWRD.

This summer, a new improvement project will start in the Gardens area to improve how storm drainage is collected and brought to this large trunk sewer on 135th Street. Crews will begin work in June to place new, larger concrete storm sewers and inlet structures in four roads: South End, 137th Street, Loomis Avenue and Short Drive. The purpose of these new larger storm sewers in the streets will be the enhanced capacity to carry rainwater out of the neighborhood and prevent further flooding.

"This is a major effort to help our Crestwood Gardens residents, south of 135th Street, get some much-needed relief from the chronic flooding that has burdened this community for too long," Mayor Klein recently said. "I am proud of our securing the over \$9 million in MWRD funding for the 135th Street project. Last year, the Village replaced the old, leaking cast-iron water mains in the Gardens neighborhood and moved the service lines to the front with new copper pipe. These new storm sewers will make a real difference, we believe. Later this fall, the Village intends to resurface all the roads in the Gardens after the sewer is installed.

"As always, investing in our infrastructure is investing in our community's future stability and increasing home values," the Mayor continued. "All our projects have this objective in mind. We ask our residents for their patience while this work is going on and their care in driving on these streets this summer and fall."

Sidewalk Construction Begins on Midlothian Turnpike

After years of securing funding from Cook County and the federal government, the long-awaited sidewalk project on Midlothian Turnpike began in May. The project involves construction of 4 miles of concrete walkway on both sides of the Turnpike, from Pulaski Road on the east and ending at Central Avenue on the west.

"The Village of Crestwood is very excited to see this project finally get started," Mayor Klein recently said. "For too long, our senior residents, young people and area pedestrians had to walk either on the roadway or

More Than 40 New Trees Planted in Village



Our Public Works Department recently received a visit from the Chicago Region Trees Initiative (CRTI) for the purpose of adding a second round of new trees to the Village. The goal of the CRTI is to enhance the health and abundance of the tree canopy in the Greater Chicago area. They analyze various layers of data throughout the region to de the most vital symbiosis between our community and the trees it's able to support.

This second round of tree planting was very successful! The Crestwood Recreation & Wellness Center and Public Works Department, along with help from volunteers, planted more than 40 trees Wednesday, May 23rd, bringing the total number of trees planted in Crestwood over the last 2 ½ years to 130 trees. The planting took place along Laramie Creek, by Nathan Hale School north of 135th St. Since cleaning up and

stabilizing the creek, we have taken down a lot of overgrown weeds and trees to replace them with 40 trees native to our area. When they start to mature it will add a lot of beauty to the creek. Thanks to everyone who gave of their time to help with the clearing and planting!



in the grass along this important corridor. The Village realized this need and pursued federal and county grant monies to pay for more than 80 percent of this project. Former Mayor Presta secured the funding while he was Mayor, and I am grateful to see this vital project through construction."

Funded by grants through the federal Surface Transportation Program (STP) and the Cook County Invest in Cook transportation program, the sidewalk project will include full ADA ramps at each crossing and intersection, retaining walls and pedestrian safety crossings. The project is slated to be completed by the end of 2023, with possible landscape restoration in Spring 2024.

According to Mayor Klein, "the Village is committed to improving sidewalks and paths throughout Crestwood. We have similar projects planned for Cicero Avenue, 135th Street and Cal-Sag Road. The improvement of the quality of life here is paramount to me and the fact that we are securing grants to pay for the great part of these costs is important to keep our Village taxes



Beware of Ruse Burglaries

Now that summer is almost here, many of us are working on projects in and around our homes. Scammers know this, which can cause an increase in the number of ruse burglaries and scams during the spring and summer. These crimes are often being committed by career criminals specializing in ruse entries and home repair fraud.

Ruse ploys often begin with the offenders creating an excuse to enter the victim's home. After selecting a home by profiling it, the offenders often claim to be a utility worker, Village employee or a contractor. They will enter the home using the ruse of checking something (water pressure, fuses, pipes). While one offender keeps the homeowner occupied, one or more additional offenders enter the home undetected and commit a burglary.

Offenders in these types of crime can obtain thousands of dollars with a relatively low risk of apprehension. Offenders will target victims who are generally less likely to make a good witness due to such things as impaired vision or memory, commonly associated with advanced age. Crimes like this often go unreported.

The typical ruse burglary takes place Monday through Friday during the day, with most occurring between 7:00am and noon. Offenders will target their victims by driving through neighborhoods looking for seniors doing yard work, or by following them from grocery stores or pharmacies.

The Crestwood Police Department urges residents to be observant of their surroundings and to report suspicious persons or activities when they occur. Residents should observe their neighbors' homes for suspicious activities and be aware that these types of crimes occur on a regular basis in every town. By calling their neighbors when they become aware of suspicious activities, they may prevent their neighbor from becoming a victim. Writing down license plates and vehicle descriptions may assist police at a later time if a crime is reported.

If you are approached by someone purporting to be a worker needing to enter your house, DO NOT LET THEM IN without first contacting the utility, Village or the police. By requesting identification from the worker, you may prevent yourself from becoming a victim by showing the offender that you are alert to the possibil-

ity that they are not who they claim to be.

Utility companies such as ComEd, Nicor, Comcast and AT&T provide employees with identification cards. Utility workers will also have utility service vehicles, so be wary of "workers" without an official vehicle. Utility workers from those companies which provide services to your home will generally only be coming to your home at your request, so if someone shows up at your door, verify who they are.

Additionally, avoid home repair scams by never allowing someone to perform driveway sealing or other repairs on the spot. Residents are advised not to let transient workers perform repair work without providing a business card, allowing you to check on the reputation of the business.

If ever in doubt, or if the person is persistent in entering your home, close and lock your door and call 9-1-1 immediately. The Police Department would rather investigate an innocent misunderstanding than have a victim of this type of crime.

Take Part in Elder Abuse Awareness Day

Abuse of our elderly takes many forms, which is why World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD) was launched on June 15, 2006, by the International Network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse and the World Health Organization at the United Nations.

The purpose of WEAAD is to provide an opportunity for communities around the world to promote a better understanding of abuse and neglect of older persons by raising awareness of the cultural, social, economic and demographic processes affecting elder abuse and neglect.

To elevate awareness and provide clarity on this difficult issue, here are some answers to common questions surrounding elder abuse:

What Is Elder Abuse?

The State of Illinois defines elder abuse or neglect as the mistreatment of a person 60 years of age or older who lives in the community. Abuse or neglect can be any of the following:

- Abuse Physical, sexual, or emotional mistreatment and/or willful confinement.
- Neglect The failure of a caregiver to provide the

older person with the necessities of life, including but not limited to food, clothing, shelter, and medical care.

- Financial Exploitation The misuse or withholding of the older person's resources by another to the disadvantage of the older person and/or the profit of another.
- Self-Neglect The inability to perform essential self-care tasks so that the older person's own health is substantially threatened.

What Causes Elder Abuse?

Often, it's hard to stay involved with and connected to our communities as we age. As a result, older people are more likely to experience social isolation, which increases the likelihood of abuse and neglect. Elder abuse affects older people across all socioeconomic groups, cultures, and races and can occur anywhere when they are disconnected from social supports:

- In a person's own home
- In nursing homes, assisted living facilities, and other institutional settings
- In hospitals

While any older person is potentially at risk of elder

abuse, some are more susceptible to experiencing abuse or neglect than others. Based on available information, women and people 80 and older are more likely to experience abuse. Factors such as dementia or poor physical health can increase older people's isolation, which in turn puts people at greater risk of experiencing abuse or neglect.

How Can We Report Elder Abuse?

To report suspected abuse, exploitation or neglect, call the statewide, 24-hour Adult Protective Services Hotline at 1-866-800-1409. For deaf and speech-impaired communication over the telephone, dial Illinois Relay at 711. If you believe that an older person is in a lifethreatening situation, contact 911 or the local police or sheriff's department.

For information and resources to assist in the care of seniors, call 1-800-252-8966. For deaf and speech-impaired communication, dial Illinois Relay at 711.

Working with our Police Department, a compiled snapshot of a month's reporting will be shown here in the Adviser. Our intent is to inform the public in order to protect and be vigilant in calling upon our Police. The Mayor urges all to stay tuned in to your neighbors' well-being and property. Call our police, report suspicious activity, be aware. (911 or Dispatch non-Emergency 708-385-5131).

Each month we continue to remind residents about all the scams that are occurring. Please remember that if anyone contacts you for any reason — overdue taxes, warrant for your arrest, allegations of illegal activity on your accounts — and offers to allow you to settle the matter by purchasing gift cards. IT IS A SCAM!

Do not give anyone on the phone your personal or banking information.

Do not allow anyone over the phone or via email or link to access your computer. $\,$

If you have any doubts at all, please contact the police department for advice. Senior Service Office Tom Dawson or any other police officer will be able to assist you in determining if it is a scam. Our officers are here 24 hours a day and would rather respond to assist you in preventing a scam then to have to take a report where you have been scammed out of thousands of dollars.

Deceptive Practice

04-10-2023: A resident reported that she received a text message from an unknown number in reference to a pending charge. The text offered a phone number to call to dispute the charge. The victim called the number and spent an excessive amount of time on the call. During the call, the victim was instructed to download an application called "AnyDesk" to her phone, which gave complete access to her phone. It was later discovered that several other applications were downloaded, including Cash App, Liberty-X and Google Play. A review of the history of these applications showed transac-

tions of which the victim had no knowledge. The victim was also requested to send a picture of her driver's license that she provided.

04-15-2023: A resident reported that he received a phone call from someone claiming to be an agent of the DEA and was questioning him about a phone that was purchased from Amazon in his name with an account that had several banking accounts attached to it. The caller started to explain that some of the accounts were discovered during a narcotics raid in Texas. The resident became suspicious of the call and HUNG UP!! JOB WELL DONE!

Discounted Rain Barrels Available to Residents

Thanks to the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District's rain barrel program, residents of Crestwood, and indeed all of Cook County, are eligible to purchase repurposed rain barrels at a discount. Rain barrels are a type of green infrastructure that capture rainwater from your roof and save it for when you need it. By keeping this water out of the sewer system, rain barrels can also help prevent sewer overflows and flooding. You can use rain barrel water to wash your car, water your lawn, or clean work boots and tools. Rain barrel water is naturally free of chlorine, lime and calcium, and some gardeners swear their plants prefer it. However, since rain barrel water is runoff from your roof, do not drink it!


Since these rain barrels are repurposed, they may have scuffs, scratches and signs of previous use. Originally, the barrels were used to transport and store olives or vegetables. Prior to home delivery, each rain barrel goes through an industrial wash system, where high pressure water is used to clean them. No cleaners or detergents are used that could alter their food-grade status. Any contents that may be left over, including the wash water, are all food grade, biodegradable and considered a nutrient for the soil.

Discounted rain barrels are available to Cook County residents while supplies last. The 2023 price of a subsidized rain barrel is \$10.75 for seniors age 65 and over, and \$21.50 for all others. Limit 2 per household.

What Can You Do to Defeat **Dangerous Summer Sun?**

The nice weather is here, and with that comes more time to spend outside. It is important to remember that all family members are at risk for injuries from the sun, but everyone can take steps to protect themselves.

Covering up and avoiding the peak hours of sun are the best ways to avoid injury from the sun.

- Wear a hat with a rim facing forward with at least a 3-inch brim. Get in the shade whenever possible and wear broad-spectrum sunglasses that protect against both UVA and UVB rays.
- Remember the peak hours of sunlight are 10:00am to 4:00pm try to avoid this window for exposed outdoor activities.
- Wear sunscreen when you are outside, every day, every time. Make it a rule for outside play and a habit, just like wearing a helmet while you are riding a

Those less than 6 months of age, or immobile, should be kept in the shade with the help of an umbrella, or covered with a hat and longer clothing. Sunscreen isn't harmful to babies, but shade is an easier option.

When buying sunscreen, look for a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 or higher. Make sure that it is labeled as broad spectrum or specifically covers UVA and UVB

rays.Sunscreen should be reapplied at least every two hours while in the sun and immediately after being out of the water, even if labeled "waterproof."
