Dear Neighbors,

First, I would like to thank everyone who attended the reopening of our renovated Biela Center on July 23rd. We are very proud of the work that was done and how well it turned out. I hope that you have had the opportunity to see this beautiful facility, and that our treasured seniors have been able to take full advantage of the wonderful resources and programs available to them. If you were not able to attend the grand opening, I encourage you to stop by and see the Biela Center staff for a tour.

National Night Out will take place Tuesday, Aug. 2nd, at 6:00pm at Walker Park. This is a great opportunity for our residents to come out and spend some quality social time getting to know the first responders in our community. Some of our emergency vehicles will be on hand, I'm told, and there will be food and entertainment for all ages. Should be a good time for everyone, so I hope we'll see many of you there.

We here at the Village are going to have to ask, once again, for a bit of patience from our residents and business owners, not least with regard to the surplus refund checks that typically are issued to our homeowners each year. Because real estate bills are going out much later this year, this necessarily pushes back our ability to get those checks to you. We will keep you informed as to when applications are available, and when deadlines for application submission are established, and at what point you can expect the checks will be distributed.

Another item I wish to address in this space this month is the need for patience with many of the projects underway by our hardworking Public Works Department. In addition to the ongoing flood project that we know everyone is anxious to have completed, we have streets that are torn up, a water main being serviced, and an additional sewer project. All of these are being delayed beyond our control — mainly due to a rock quarry strike that has affected all of these projects. We really hope that they will have their issues resolved soon so that we can get things back on schedule. In the meantime, please be patient and cautious on the roads. I apologize for the inconvenience, and want you to please know that we are doing everything possible to make this time during construction as bearable as possible.

It's back to school time, and I want to wish all of our Village kids welcome back to school. I wish you a great year ahead. This is another reason that I want to impress upon our residents and business owners the need for safety while driving. Please be sure to pay special attention behind the wheel, as school will be back in session and kids will be on the streets.

Recycling Reminder

This is just a reminder to all residents and businesses to prevent contaminated recyclables from going into our recycling bins. This applies to everything, but food items in particular are a common problem. Used pizza takeout boxes, bottles, cans or jars that haven't been thoroughly rinsed, aluminum foil of any sort whether clean or not, as well as disposable foil pans of the sort used in baking or for catering, are all items that can contaminate the pool of recyclables and cause them — along with everything else in their vicinity — to be unfit for recycling, defeating the purpose of the program. When this happens, it forces recycling companies like Republic Services to find alternative solutions for the contaminated materials, and it substantially increases costs for local recycling programs.

Republic Services remains committed to providing us with reliable services. Extreme action is necessary to keep our local recycling programs operating as intended. We must work together as a Village to do better. As usual, the Village will take on any additional cost for service, but we are asking you to do your part as residents. Your Home Maintenance **Checklist**

Any homeowner knows that their dwellings need constant care and attention, be it for repairs or general maintenance, renovations or additions. Balancing the protection of your home's value with the protection of your wallet can be tricky, but by handling vital maintenance tasks at least twice a year, you can ensure a safe, efficient and costminimizing home. Here are some tips to help you to do so:

Plumbing

Preventing water damage is a lot less expensive than fixing it after the fact. That is why it's best to make sure your home's plumbing is working properly now. Some key items to check include:

- Toilets Check for leaks in the water feed and the bottom of your tank.
- Sinks Check all faucets, hose bibs and supply valves for leakage.
- Bathrooms Check for evidence of water leaks under sinks, showers, toilets and tubs.
- Water Heater Drain the water until it's clear of sediment. Inspect the flue assembly and check for corrosion. If this doesn't sound like a DIY task for you, not to worry: Most plumbers can handle it in under an hour.

Appliances

To help your everyday essentials last longer, make sure to inspect the following as part of your semiannual checklist:

Washing Machine – Clean water inlet filters, check the hoses and replace any that are leaking.



A bit of extra attention to your home year round can ensure its safety, efficiency and overall market value.

- Dryer Vacuum any lint from the dryer ducts and the surrounding areas.
- Refrigerator Clean the drain hole and the pan (this should be done more often in warmer weather), wash the door gasket and vacuum the condenser coils.

Electrical

Trip any circuit breakers and ground fault interrupters monthly to ensure proper protection. For anything involving wiring or electrical work, hiring a licensed electrician is money well spent.

That said, you should check exposed wiring in your home every six months for frayed cords or wires. If anything looks damaged or dangerous, call in a professional to take a further look.

Basement

Check your basement and foundation for cracks and excess moisture. If either problem is severe, bring in a professional to discuss what can be done to remedy the issue and prevent future damage.




A little cleaning and caulking should be part of your semi-annual home maintenance checklist, too. At least every six months, take a few minutes to work

- Exhaust fans Clean the grill and fan blades.
- Range hood fans Wash the fan blades and their housing.
- Interior caulking and grout Inspect the caulking and grout around tubs, showers and sinks. If the caulking has been pulled away, you should scrape it out and re-caulk, or call in a professional who can.



Moraine Valley Employee Piloting Virtual Peace Corps

The Moraine Valley Community College dean of Learning Enrichment and College Readiness is helping pilot a virtual option for participating in the Peace Corps. Michael Morsches was chosen for this project because of his vast experience with the corps over the last three decades.

In the late '80s, Morsches began his Peace Corps experience teaching in Jamaica. Since then, he has been involved in various projects overseas and decided to apply to this new virtual program. After a competitive process, he was accepted.

"I am very honored to have been chosen for participation in this project. Opening the Peace Corps mission to new generations and Americans who cannot participate in the traditional manner of service is an incredible opportunity," Morsches said. "This program exemplifies the three goals of Peace Corps service envisioned by John Kennedy: To help the people of interested countries in meeting their need for trained men and women. To help promote a better understanding of Americans on the part of the peoples served. To help promote a better understanding of other peoples on the part of Americans."

For more than 60 years, participants had only two in-person ways to join the Peace Corps, which requires a two-year commitment overseas and a short-term assignment to provide high-impact

responses to global emergencies.

The Virtual Service Pilot allows previous Peace Corps volunteers to donate their time virtually helping others around the world in some capacity. Participants spend five to 15 hours per week for 12 to 27 weeks collaborating with a host country counterpart on tasks to advance the philanthropic mission of the Peace Corps and lend their expertise in environmental issues, educational programming, technology, youth development, literacy, English teacher training and more.

Since June 2, Morsches has been working with a rural community center, the Association Center Novau for Excellence, in El Mers, a small town in Morocco. His counterpart, Abdelmajid Tiloulout, is the English Club facilitator/president of the center, which has a club for English, math, and extra activities. The two meet a few times per week to discuss pedagogy, and strategies to start and sustain an engaging student group. Together, they are working to expand the existing English Club to more members and helping students to improve their English skills to get better placement into more competitive university programs. For now, Tiloulout is meeting with the students, who voluntarily participate, to establish the group before Morsches meets them. They ultimately want to create an English language cohort in the school with a fouryear program for younger learners.

"This collaboration with Michael will surely help improve the way I am personally working with my students thanks to his experience in the field of teaching and monitoring teachers, especially because I am a beginner teacher and still need to know many things related to teaching," Tiloulout said. "This program will help students improve their linguistic abilities and prepare them for their university studies, especially because most of the references related to science are written in English."

Currently, the program is limited to returning Peace Corps volunteers but eventually will open to all qualified U.S. citizens.

Back to School Means Being Extra Cautious Behind the Wheel

As August leads into September, our children will be heading back to school. While you're out and about in the Village, please keep your eyes open for children walking, biking, skating or riding scooters around the Village. That extra bit of caution you exercise while driving can help to avoid needless tragedy.

Dropping Off

We know that it can be frustrating to wait your turn to drop off your children, and to observe the required protocols, but to minimize the potential for accidents, please be sure that you're following the rules specific to your child's school, and observe the following rules, which apply to all school zones:

- Don't double park. Doing so blocks visibility for pedestrians and other
- Don't load or unload your children across the street from their school.
- Carpool whenever possible to help reduce congestion at the drop-off point.

Look Out for the Little Ones

Research by the National Safety Council suggests that most children who lose their lives in bus-related incidents are pedestrians between the ages of 4-7. They may be hit by the bus, or by a motorist illegally passing a stopped bus. Please take the time to review what you can do to help keep our most vulnerable pedestrians safe:

- Don't force pedestrians to walk around you when you're stopped at a red light or waiting to make a turn — keep the crosswalk clear so they don't have to walk around and into traffic.
- When flashers are blinking in a school zone, always stop and yield to pedestrians crossing the crosswalk or intersection.
- Always observe and respect the school patrol officer or crossing guard holding up a stop sign.
- Be extra conscious, when in school zones or near playgrounds and parks, of the likely presence of children.
- Never honk or rev your engine to intimidate a pedestrian, even if you do have the right of way.
- Never pass a vehicle that's stopped for crossing pedestrians.
- Always exercise extreme care to avoid striking pedestrians in any circumstance, regardless of who has the right of way.

Be Aware of School Buses

If you're driving behind a school bus, always maintain a following distance adequate enough to allow time to stop. And never — never — pass a school bus that is stopped to load or unload children. Not only is it unsafe for children, but it's also illegal.

- Never pass a bus from behind, or from either direction if you're on a road with no median, if the bus is stopped to deliver or pick up children.
- Traffic must stop if the yellow or red lights on a school bus are flashing and the stop arm is extended.
- The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children. Ensure their safety by stopping far enough back to allow them space to safely enter and exit the bus.
- Children are unpredictable, and often ignore hazards or take risks: Be aware and prepared in case they are not.

With a little forethought and caution, automobiles and young students can co-exist safely in our school zones.

Students in Moraine Valley Community College's commercial driver's license (CDL) certificate program received scholarships, made possible by a \$10,000 donation from United Parcel Service (UPS), throughout the year, with the final ones awarded in late June. The donation from UPS provided \$500 scholarships to 20 students in the program for tuition and program-related expenses. Program participants were encouraged to apply for the scholarship when they began the CLD program.

The company worked with the Moraine Valley Foundation to set up the UPS Commercial Driver's License Certificate Program Scholarship to help address the nationwide shortage of truck drivers.

"We are impressed with UPS's commitment to our community, the college and our students," said Kristy McGreal, executive director of the Foundation. "They not only understand the need for highly skilled drivers, but they also provided funding toward a practical solution to solve this serious workforce gap."

Steve Pappageorge, executive director of Community Education, Workforce Development and Government Relations at Moraine Valley, noted the growing need for CDL drivers.

"The shortage of drivers has gotten worse since the

pandemic started. Logistics and transportation firms need drivers to deliver goods and services across the country, as well as locally," Pappageorge said. "There is a huge opportunity for men and women to start a new career that pays well and has high employability."

Moraine Valley offers its truck driving program in partnership with 160 Driving Academy, which offers CDL training across the nation. Students take 40 hours of classroom work at the college and complete their behind-the-wheel experience offsite in South Holland or Harvey. Most students complete the program in five to seven weeks.

The UPS scholarship was awarded to students who completed an application and demonstrated a

strong need for CDL training.

"Some of our students are single parents trying to better their family's lives," Pappageorge said. "Others have lost jobs or businesses and need to start over. We considered their need and what they want to do in the future. We also looked for women and underrepresented people when awarding the funds. The scholarship helped them pursue their new career. Recipients are not required to work for UPS after completing the program. UPS has been very generous, and they want to help people enter the field because they know there's a great need for drivers."

- >>> Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- >>> Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- 333 Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

- >>> There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
-)) If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- >>> Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- >>> There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use
- >>> When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light scap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.






