Fire Department Places Two New Fire Engines in Service

Advanced Life Support (ALS) On April 17th the Crestwood Fire capable to respond to medical

Department placed the first of two new engines (Engine 2313) in service and on May 24th the department placed the second in service (Engine 2303). The department officially took delivery of the rigs in August of 2022, however delays in orders for equipment and fabrication for the new rigs set the date back to place them in service by several months.

The fire engines were custom built by Seagrave Fire Apparatus in Clintonville, WI. They each are outfitted with 2000 gallon per minute pumps and 750-gallon water tanks. They both are set up with extrication equipment for vehicle accidents and are

emergencies, aside from normal firefighting duties.

Especially important, as a sense of tradition on the fire department, they both have the bells from the first fire engines purchased by the Crestwood Fire Department in 1966 and 1970.

Chief Jon Newton: "Seagrave is an excellent fire apparatus manufacturer, and I have no doubt that these rigs will serve the community for the next two decades. The department is excited and proud to put these rigs in service. These are state of the art engines that are cost effective and designed to last."

Village Residents that Ride our Village Pace Bus will travel in style. The Village has a new updated Pace Bus!




attention at the wheel will help ensure a school, year free of tragic accidents. Let's all do our part to keep our children safe on our streets.

STEAM Camp at capacity for first time

Whether learning to build bridges, create Origami, write basic computer code, or construct and program robots, students enrolled in summer STEAM camps in District 218 enjoy themselves. And they, or perhaps their parents, have been telling others about the experience.

Enrollment in the camps, planned by Moraine Valley Community College computer science Professor Larry Langellier, grew steadily.

Several years ago District 218 doubled the number of camps at Eisenhower, Richards, and

Shepard high schools – this summer, for the first time, administrators needed to create waiting lists.

The camps, offered free of charge, feature age-appropriate science, technology, art, engineering, and math activities for students in grades 3 to 5 and grades 6 to 8.

The added camps require more staff. Langellier leads activities along with his daughter, Lexi, a doctoral student at Northern Illinois University; one of his MVCC students, Ruby Radosevic, also teaches at the camps.



Working with our Police Department, a compiled snapshot of a month's reporting will be shown here in the Adviser. Our intent is to inform the public in order to protect and be vigilant in calling upon our Police. The Mayor urges all to stay tuned in to your neighbors' well-being and property. Deceptive Practice

06-14-2023: Officers were dispatched to Jersey Subs in reference a deceptive practice. Upon arrival, officers learned that a women, who resides in the state of Maryland, had called the store after receiving notifications that nine separate orders were placed using her identity. The suspects had attempted to pick up the orders but fled before police could arrive.

Moraine Valley and Governors State partner on TransferBOOST initiative

Moraine Valley Community College and Governors State University (GSU) recently joined the statewide TransferBOOST (Bachelor's Opportunity Options that are Straightforward and Transparent) initiative by partnering to offer a new transfer pathway. This collaboration grants Moraine Valley students guaranteed admission into several GSU degree programs by completing a qualifying Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree.

The TransferBOOST initiative is a multi-year, state-level initiative developed to provide students with an affordable, well-supported pathway from an associate degree to a bachelor's degree. The TransferBOOST initiative in Illinois is a collaboration among the Institute for Higher Education Policy, HCM Strategists, Illinois Board of Higher Education, Illinois Community College Board, three public universities and five community colleges.

Students earning an A.A.S. degree often immediately enter a career after they graduate. Since A.A.S. degrees provide a strong academic foundation and specialized knowledge, they also can be a springboard for students to pursue a bachelor's degree, which may help them advance in their careers.

The TransferBOOST initiative between Moraine Valley and GSU creates a transfer pathway for students with specific A.A.S. degrees to complete a bachelor's degree affordably and in a timely manner. The agreement allows Moraine Valley students with this degree and a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher to transfer to the university under the initiative and enroll in a minimum of six credit hours to receive a renewable \$2,500 award per academic year. This is in addition to other financial aid and scholarships.

Dr. Pamela Haney, president of Moraine Valley, said, "The TransferBOOST collaboration with Governors State University will provide an equitable and clear pathway for our students as they transfer from Moraine Valley to GSU. I applaud everyone involved in making this initiative happen. I am sure students who take advantage of this opportunity will benefit greatly from it."

"We are so pleased to formalize our TransferBOOST agreement with

Moraine Valley Community College," added Dr. Beverly Schneller, Governors State University's provost and vice president of Academic Affairs. "GSU and Moraine Valley continue to provide excellent, collaboratively designed learning opportunities for students in the Southland. We look forward to our ongoing partnership grounded in high quality academic programs and strong learning support systems to promote student success on their journeys to excellence."

The two institutions mapped out clearly defined pathways for students to earn their bachelor's degree at GSU after earning an A.A.S. degree in several areas of study, including health care, early childhood education and information technology.

Dr. Scott Friedman, Moraine Valley's dean of Student Engagement, said, "The Governors State University and Moraine Valley faculty held extensive discussions to ensure the maximum amount of transfer credit would be granted to our students."




SAFETY TIPS

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom. They should also be outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home. Install alarms in the basement.
- Large homes may need extra smoke alarms.
- It is best to use interconnected smoke alarms.
 When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month.
 Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.
- Current alarms on the market employ different types of technology including multi-sensing, which could include smoke and carbon monoxide combined.
- Today's smoke alarms will be more technologically advanced to respond to a multitude of fire conditions, yet mitigate false alarms.
- A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall. Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen to reduce false alarms. They should be at least 10 feet (3 meters) from the stove.
- People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.

FACTS

- A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level. Smoke alarms should be connected so when one sounds, they all sound. Most homes do not have this level of protection.
- Roughly 3 out of 5 fire deaths happen in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.
