Final band camp for Shepard band director

When retiring Shepard High School band director Chris Pitlik chose the music and title for his final field show, he thought long.

A proud Shepard graduate from 1985, Pitlik begins his final year leading the band program. Starting in 1991 no Shepard band student has known another teacher besides Pitlik. One can imagine his investment in the program. Apart from earning his bachelor's and master's degrees, Pitlik has been involved in Shepard band every year since 1981.

When he returned to campus in 1991, the marching band featured fewer than 30 students. Pitlik went to work and never stopped. Today with shelves full of trophies the Marching Astros consistently hover around 90 students, with many other students enrolled in jazz band and other classes.

Given how much the program has grown and evolved and his coming retirement, Pitlik chose the theme 'Happily Ever After' for the new field show that the Marching Astros will perform at football games and in competition. The show features music from Disney movies and the Kevin Costner version of Robin Hood.

Pitlik explained his choice to parents and students on the final day of marching band camp last Friday. "Happily Ever After' references the experiences his students received in the Shepard band program, looking back on his career, and walking into retirement knowing he gave everything as an educator.



General McArthur III fills big shoes as new Moraine Valley Athletics director

General McArthur III became the new Athletics director (AD) at Moraine Valley Community College on July 1.

McArthur has been adjusting to the new role, vacated by Bill Finn when he retired June 30 after 43 years at the college. Finn, also the men's basketball coach for the first 23 years, built the program as only the second Moraine Valley AD. McArthur is excited to take over the reins and maintain the program's successful traditions.

"I feel a little pressure to continue winning because Bill had a great legacy of that and helping students. But, I think with the help of my team, we can continue the winning tradition and helping students even after they leave Moraine Valley," McArthur said. "Bill left great groundwork to build on."

McArthur takes over a storied program that includes 10 Illinois Skyway Collegiate Conference All-Sports trophies, hundreds of student-athletes earning academic honors, 57 teams competing at nationals, 30 All-Americans and a six-year-old Athletics Hall of Fame, among many highlights. And he's ready to move the program forward.

"I want more student-athletes to graduate but also have a good experience while they are here, have them more involved on campus with more community exposure. We need to make sure they're as prepared as possible when they transfer and graduate. I also want our campus to be excited about Athletics because we have great teams," he said. "I, of course, want to bring the All-Sports trophy back here. I want to win academically and athletically."

That mix of school and sports led McArthur to this job. At first, he thought about becoming a lawyer because he grew up in a rough neighborhood. A quick college visit to Princeton University helped him realize that wasn't the right path. He was good in math and thought becoming an accountant would be ideal. After earning a bachelor's in accounting as a first-generation college student and working in the field, he was unhappy.

He later earned an MBA with a concentration in finance and a master's degree in human resources with a concentration in marketing. He first taught economics at DeVry University, where he met Dr. JoAnn Jenkins, Moraine Valley dean of Student Success. That led to him teaching College 101 and developmental math part time at the college 15 years ago. McArthur ultimately became the Veteran Services coordinator, and in 2015, he moved over to Athletics as the athletic student success specialist.

"I wanted to be involved in sports but didn't know what kind of careers were available. Accounting seemed like a viable option at the time," McArthur recalled. "When Gloria [Coughlin, former athletic student success specialist] retired, I saw the job opening and wanted to work in Athletics. I figured Bill would eventually retire, so my plan was to become AD."

McArthur's background in sports includes playing baseball in high school and basketball intramurally. For the last 21 summers, he's coached park district or travel baseball, starting with his son's team. He's even coached overseas. He knows junior college sports because his son played baseball at one, so he understands what the student-athletes deal with on a daily basis.

In his role prior to becoming AD, McArthur worked with hundreds of students and helped the Cyclones baseball team for a time. Finn introduced him to aspects of the job so he'd be ready to jump in.

"General has really done a fantastic job learning the nuances of being a college athletic director in the past three years. Moraine Valley's amazing, successful athletic history regionally and nationally is in good hands," Finn commented.

McArthur hit the ground running at the start of July as did his replacement, Marie Harrell.

"It was fast-paced at first, but we'll be ready for the school year to start," McArthur said. "I'm excited for the new academic year and for the new president of our college [Dr. Pamela Haney also started July 1]. We have a lot to look forward to."

Children experience fire interest. They may ask questions such as how hot is fire or show an interest in fire through playing with fire trucks or cooking on a play stove. This is healthy, and it is time to begin educating about fire.

- Firestarting happens when children begin to experiment with fire using matches and lighters. Many fires happen when young children are left alone, even for a short period of time, and have access to matches and lighters. Parents must have clear rules and consequences about fire misuse.
- Grown-ups can help keep fire out of the hands of children
- Store matches and lighters out of children's reach and sight, up high, preferably in a locked cabinet or container.
- Never leave matches or lighters in a bedroom or any place where children may go without supervision.
- Teach young children and school-age children to tell a grown-up if they see matches or lighters. Children need to understand that fire is difficult to control, it is fast and can hurt as soon as it touches you.
- · A child with an interest in fire can lead to fire starting and result in repeated firesetting behavior.
- It is important for grown-ups to discourage unsupervised fire starts.
- · Never use lighters or matches as a source of amusement for children; they may imitate you.
- Never assign a young child any tasks that involve the use of a lighter or matches (lighting candles, bringing a lighter to an adult to light a cigarette or the fireplace, etc.)
- If your child expresses curiosity about fire or has been playing with fire, calmly but firmly explain that matches and lighters are tools for adults only.
- Use only lighters designed with child-resistant features. Remember, child-resistant does not mean child-proof.






