Frontier League Tryout Camp returns to the Chicago Southland for the first time in two decades

The Frontier League of Professional Baseball, a Partner League of Major League Baseball, has announced that the 32nd Annual Tryout Camp and Draft will take place on Tuesday, April 22 and Wednesday, April 23, 2025. The event will be hosted at Ozinga Field, the home of the Windy City Thunder-Bolts, in Crestwood, Illinois.

Along with managers from all 18 Frontier League clubs, scouts and members from several MLB teams and other independent leagues will also be present. This year will be the first to include the Mississippi Mud Monsters and the Down East Bird Dawgs, who own the first two picks in the draft, respectively.

"The ThunderBolts are very excited to welcome great baseball talent from around the country and from all over the world, as well as the managers and representatives from the Frontier League to the Chicago Southland," said ThunderBolts' General Manager Mike VerSchave. "The tryout camp is a great event each year, featuring players who are sure to make an impact on Frontier League rosters and beyond and we're proud to be a part of it."

Tryout activities will begin at 9:00 a.m. on April 22 and will include fielding, throwing and baserunning drills for all position players; all position players will also participate in batting practice. Pitchers will throw bullpens in front of team and league evaluators and scouts. The field managers will then post which players are to be invited back for Wednesday's simulated intrasquad game. Following the games, there



will be a 30-minute break to allow each team to prepare for the draft.

"The Tryout Camp and Draft has proven to be a great opportunity for free agent players to showcase themselves to our managers immediately before our spring training opens," said Frontier League Commissioner Steve Tahsler. "Dozens of players have gone from the Tryout Camp to Frontier League rosters and then signed with MLB organizations, including four who have appeared in MLB games."

Of the 44 players taken in the 2024 draft, 19 saw regular season action in the Frontier League and three more played in other MLB Partner Leagues. Derrick Edington, who was drafted in 2023 by the host Windy City ThunderBolts, was signed by the Tampa Bay Rays in May 2024 and was recently selected to participate in the Arizona Fall League.

The 2025 Frontier League Draft will be streamed live on social media. Further details will be released closer to the date of the draft.

At age seventy-six, Judy advises all budding artists, to never stop following their passion and what gives them true joy.


DON'T FORGET your 2025 Vehicle Stickers!



We Watch, We Call!

Mayor Ken Klein and the Board of Trustees have heard the requests of many to report crimes in our Village. Working with our Police Department, a compiled snapshot of a month's reporting will be shown here in the Adviser. Our intent is to inform the public in order to protect and be vigilant in calling upon our Police. The Mayor urges all to stay tuned in to your neighbors' well-being and property. Call our police, report suspicious activity, be aware. (911 or Dispatch non-Emergency 708-385-5131).

Deceptive Practice

12-09-2024: A resident reported that she started receiving calls and text messages from a subject who identified himself as being with BMO Harris bank. The text messages included text messages to approve or deny fraudulent charges. After a few days of receiving these text messages, the subject called the victim and explained to her that they were investigating the bank tellers who were involved in scams and that they needed the victim's assistance. The subject convinced the victim to provide her user name, password and card information. The subject then convinced her to mail her debit card to an address in Florida. The suspect advised that the card was needed to be used as evidence against the tellers and that a new card would be sent to her. The victim became suspicious when the new card was not sent. The victim then logged into her banking account and discovered that \$66,000.00 was missing from her checking account and \$70,000.00 from her savings account.

12-17-2024: A resident reported that she had been involved in an over the phone relationship with a man that she met on facebook who allegedly lived in London. The victim would talk to the subject several times day and over the past several months has sent multiple gift cards in the amount of \$60,000.00. The victim also sent \$40,000.00 in cash to through the postal service to an address in Nebraska. The subject was scheduled to arrive at Midway Airport on December 14th, however, when he didn't arrive the victim realized she had been scammed.

12-28-2024: A resident reported that she received a bill from Verizon for an account in which she did not open. An unknown suspect opened the account using her information and was able to purchase an Apple I-phone.

12-28-2025: A resident reported that she received a notification

from the mobile app (Majority) that money had been withdrawn from her account. Upon checking her account, she discovered multiple unauthorized withdrawals for a total of 900.00.

Carbon Monoxide Safety: An Important Message from the **Crestwood Fire Department**

Winter is here again, and with the arrival of cold weather comes the increased risk of carbon monoxide (CO) in the home. Carbon monoxide is an invisible, colorless, odorless gas created when fuels burn incompletely. This threat is heightened during winter with increased use of heaters and less ventilation in the home. CO is called the "silent killer" and exposure can result in illness and death. Keep yourself and your family safe this winter with these tips:

- Install a CO detector on every level of your home, including the basement, and place them in or near sleeping areas
- In a multi-unit building, install one in each unit and in the common/laundry area
- Test your CO alarms once a month
- Remove your vehicle from an attached garage while warming it up. Do not leave vehicles running in the garage, even if the door is open
- Clear snow from the vents for your dryer, furnace, stove and fireplace
- Make sure the flue is open when using a fireplace
- Never use an oven to heat your home, only use an oven while cooking food
- Do not use a generator indoors or in a garage. Only use them outside in a wellventilated area
- Keep fuel-burning appliances clean, maintained and well-vented
- Be aware of CO poisoning symptoms, which include unexplained headaches, dizziness, nausea, vomiting, weakness, sleepiness and confusion

If your CO alarm is activated, or you suspect symptoms of CO poisoning, move everyone to fresh air and call 911.






Shepard bowling team wins IHSA Regional Championship
