


FEATURED ARTIST MAY DONNA STAPEL BODDY

Donna Stapel Boddy grew up close by in Calumet Park. She remembers loving to color at a very early age.

At Eisenhower High School in Blue Island, Boddy focused on academics to prepare for college. Her college roommate at Bradley University in Peoria was an art major, so they attended many exhibits together and talked "art." Boddy continued her studies at University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, obtaining Bachelor of Arts and Master of Science degrees in Economics and got married at that time. She worked as a Human Resource Manager before taking time off to raise three children. As a parent volunteer, she ran the Art Awareness Program for District 118, Grades K-8, for 10 years and the 6th Grade hands-on Art Fair. During this time, Boddy attended the annual Art Volunteers in the Classroom (AVIC) seminars at the Art Institute, learning about the Masters and the Art Institute's collections. She became a Reading Teacher in 2000 until retiring in 2013.

When she traveled, Boddy pointed out that she always sought out art museums and bought many art books through the years. Upon retirement, she began using colored pencils and markers in adult coloring books. She especially enjoyed coloring mandalas. She then learned drawing skills from Andrea Fox, former District 230 Art Teacher, through the senior Renaissance Corner Academy in Orland Park, where



she currently lives. This blossomed into oil painting when she joined the Town and Country Art League (TCAL) about 7 years ago when her friend and fellow teacher, Carol Chirafisi, suggested she join. She continued honing her skills with Chirafisi, who continues to mentor many students at weekly sessions at the Biela Center. To this continued involvement, Boddy acknowledged: "We never stop learning!"

Boddy stresses that she has learned from many artists at the monthly TCAL meetings as well as other artist groups and workshops. She exhibits her art at local libraries, the Vogt Visual Arts Center in Tinley Park, and presently at the Orland Park Library. She has served as TCAL Treasurer for the past six years. She emphasized that art brings her satisfaction and calmness, and the friendships she has formed are invaluable.

We Watch, We Call!

Mayor Ken Klein and the Board of Trustees have heard the requests of many to report crimes in our Village. Working with our Police Department, a compiled snapshot of a month's reporting will be shown here in the Adviser. Our intent is to inform the public in order to protect and be vigilant in calling upon our Police. The Mayor urges all to stay tuned in to your neighbors' well-being and property. Call our police, report suspicious activity, be aware. (911 or Dispatch non-Emergency 708-385-5131).

Deceptive Practice

03-07-2025: A resident reported that while he was out of town for an extended period of time, several unauthorized purchases were made using his Old National Bank debit card.

03-15-2025: An elderly resident reported while using her computer, a message appeared for her to contact Microsoft Support in reference computer issues. After contacting the number provided, she was advised that her computer and identity had been hacked and was being used for illegal activity. She was then transferred to an alleged agent of the Federal Trade Commission. This subject assured her that that could rectify her issues and secure her accounts and identity. As the conversation continued over the new few days, the victim was convinced that she

needed to purchase five (5) bars of 10 ounce gold. The victim was given multiple locations where she would be able to make the purchase. After contacting the store, she then went to the bank and arranged a wire transfer for \$146,750. An employee at the bank questioned the victim if she was being coerced in any way, however, since the caller told the victim not to discuss the issue with anyone, she denied any wrong doing and the bank completed the transfer. After the victim purchased the gold bars, she was instructed to meet the federal agent in the parking lot at 123rd/ Cicero in Alsip, while remaining on the phone with the subject. Once she arrived, she handed over the box containing the gold bars.

Theft

03-05-2025: A woman reported while working out at Planet

Fitness, unknown suspects stole her wallet from her unsecured locker. Her credit cards were then used to attempt purchases at TJ

03-06-2025: A regional manager for Snipes discovered that an employee had been performing fraudulent refunds to himself in order to receive the money. A check of the video surveillance showed numerous fraudulent returns, valued at \$1,769. When the manager questioned the employee, he fled the store before the police arrived.

03-11-2025: It was reported that an I-Pad was taken from a business in the 4600 block of 1367th street. A check of video surveillance was conducted, where it was observed that an employee had actually taken the I-Pad. The employee was taken into custody and charged with felony theft.

03-25-2025: Unknown suspects stole a 2015 Hyundai Genesis from the AMC Movie Theater parking lot.
