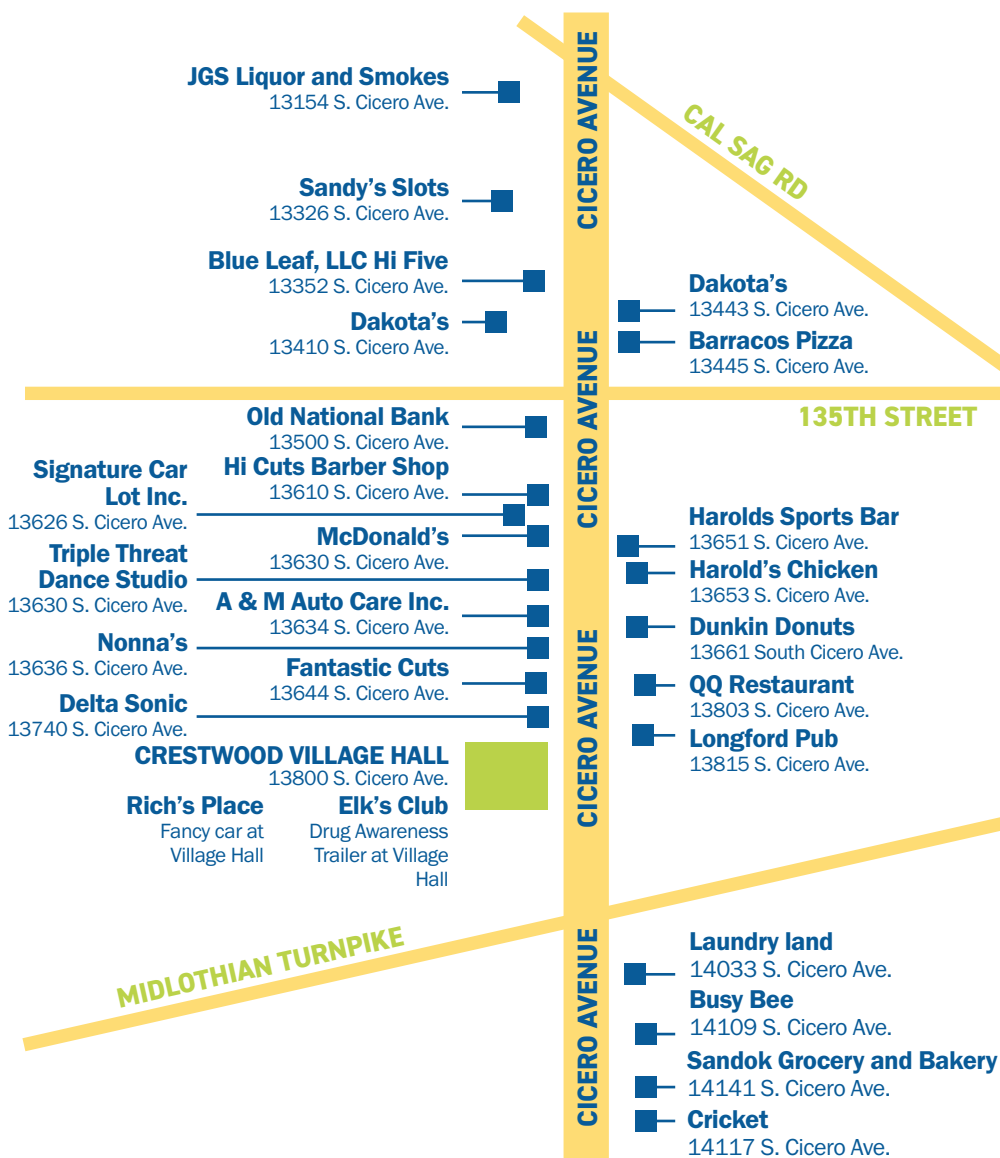

Village of Crestwood Parking

Crestwood Village ordinance prohibits parking on any village street between 2:00am and 6:00am. The reason for this ordinance is so police will be alerted to abandoned vehicles or suspicious vehicles that require investigation. This ordinance also ensures that all streets throughout the Village will be open to fire and rescue equipment in the event of an overnight emergency. This is especially necessary in areas where narrow streets can block large fire trucks. We will continue to enforce this ordinance. Thank you for your cooperation with this ordinance. 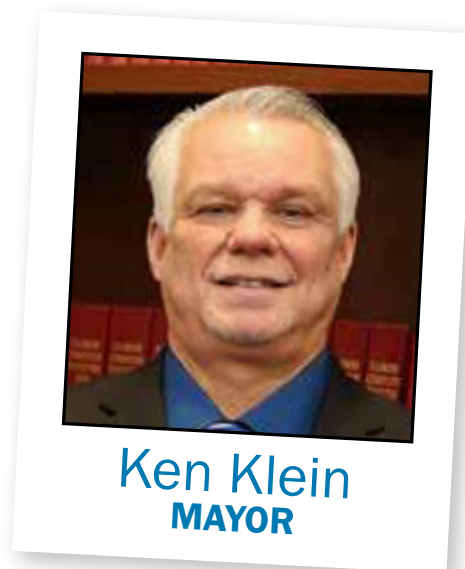

CRESTWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT



We Watch, We Call!

Mayor Ken Klein and the Board of Trustees have heard the requests of many to report crimes in our Village. Working with our Police Department, a compiled snapshot of a month's reporting will be shown here in the Adviser. Our intent is to inform the public in order to protect and be vigilant in calling upon our Police. The Mayor urges all to stay tuned in to your neighbors' well-being and property. Call our police, report suspicious activity, be aware. (911 or Dispatch non-Emergency 708-385-5131).

Deceptive Practice

08-01-2025: A resident reported that she received a letter in the mail from the Illinois Department of Security stating that she would be receiving unemployment benefits. The victim advised she has never filed for unemployment benefits and doesn't know who used her identity to file the claim.

08-05-2025: A resident reported that he received a bill from Verizon Wireless for an account that he never opened. It was discovered that the account was opened using his identity on July 29th in Bolingbrook, where four iPhone 16's were purchased on the account.

08-08-2025: A woman who recently moved in to Crestwood, received a letter forwarded in the US mail from an address in Chicago. Upon reading the letter, the woman discovered that her identity had been used and that someone was receiving funds from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). The letter indicated that there was an overpayment for over \$2000.00 for which they were requesting payment. The victim does not know who used her identity to obtain the funds.

8-14-2025: A resident reported he discovered that a check that he issued to the U.S. Department of Education for \$350.00 was altered and now made payable to an individual for \$500.00.

08-14-2025: A resident reported that he received a letter from the Illinois Department of Revenue in reference to receiving unemployment security benefits. The victim advised she has never applied for unemployment benefits and doesn't know who used her identity to file the claim.

08-22-2025: A resident reported that upon conducting a credit check it was discovered that there was an outstanding account from Comcast with a \$4000.00 balance. The victim has never had a Comcast account and does not know who used her identity to obtain the services.

Retail Theft

08-01-2025: It was reported by Pet Smart Management that an unknown male black suspect walked out of the Pet Smart with a Fluval Aquarium filter valued at

\$359.00. Employees attempted to stop the subject but he left the store and entered a black Buick Encore and then fled the scene.

08-04-2025: Target Loss Prevention reported that a male white suspect entered the store and gathered \$743.00 worth of merchandise before leaving the store and fleeing in a silver Pickup truck with no registration.

08-08-2025: Officers responded to the Target store for a report of a black female suspect who had just fled the store in a black BMW with unpaid merchandise. Upon officers arrival, they learned that the suspect had gathered 12 cans of formula valued at \$315.00 and that the vehicle was last seen eastbound through the mall. A short time later, a Crestwood Auxiliary officer observed the vehicle in the Holiday Inn Express parking lot. Officers arrived on scene and made contact with a subject, who matched the description. As officers spoke with the subject they also observed the cans of formula in the car. The subject admitted to stealing the merchandise and was taken into custody and charged with retail theft.

08-11-2025: Target Loss Prevention reported that two male white juveniles entered the store, selected and concealed 11 packages of PSD underwear valued at \$264.00. The suspects were seen leaving the rear of the store on red minibikes.

08-15-2025: Target Loss Prevention reported three suspects entered the store and selected 14 packages of PSD underwear valued at \$336.00. Loss prevention attempted to stop the three suspects, however, they fled in a gray Toyota minivan that was last seen east bound on Cal-Sag Road.

08-21-2025: Kohl's Loss Prevention reported two female black suspects entered the store, gathered jewelry and went to the female bathroom. The suspects then proceeded to the cosmetics area and began concealing travel size fragrances. Loss prevention attempted to detain the suspects, however, they fled with \$519.00 worth of merchandise in a white Volkswagen.

08-23-2025: Menard's Loss Prevention reported that a male, black suspect entered the store and retrieved a shopping cart. The suspect then went into an aisle

where there were boxes of gallons of water. The suspect emptied the boxes of water, then proceeded to the electrical wire aisle. The suspect placed a total of 5 (500 ft spools) of twelve gauge wire into the empty boxes. The suspect proceeded to the register and paid for the "water" leaving the store with \$595.00 worth of unpaid merchandise.

08-24-2025: Target Loss Prevention reported that they observed a male suspect carrying a backpack gathering items. The suspect was selecting items including PSD underwear and t-shirts and loading them into the backpack. He then exited the store without making payment. As officers arrived they observed the suspect fleeing on a blue and white motorcycle. The suspect refused to stop and fled into the Playfield Drive area.

Theft

08-04-2025: A victim reported after completing his workout at Planet Fitness, he returned the locker room to retrieve his items from an unlocked locker and discovered the keys to his vehicle were missing. Upon checking his vehicle, he discovered that his wallet containing 5 credit cards was missing.

08-07-2025: Unknown suspects stole a 2015 Dodge Charger from the 136th block of Lamon.

08-10-2025: Unknown suspects broke into a 2014 Jeep Patriot that was parked in the Planet Fitness parking lot. The unknown suspects took a wallet containing credit cards and approximately \$30.00 in cash.

08-11-2025: Unknown suspects stole a 2016 Cadillac ATS that was parked in the Menard's parking lot.

08-11-2025: Unknown suspects stole a 2020 Jeep from the 5300 block of Waterbury Drive. The vehicle was later found in the 120th block of Indiana Ave in Chicago.

08-12-2025: A victim reported after completing his workout at Planet Fitness, he realized his car keys were no longer in his locker. Upon checking his vehicle, he discovered that his wallet was missing, containing his credit cards and \$40.00 in currency.

08-19-2025: A victim reported after completing his workout at Planet Fitness, he discovered his keys were missing from his unlocked locker. Upon checking his vehicle he discovered his wallet containing credit cards was missing.

FEATURED ARTIST OCTOBER

CAROL LETT



According to Carol Lett, a resident of Chicago, she never had formal training in art during her childhood, but remembers that she always had an appreciation of the elements of art. Her mother always took special care to add a creative touch to everything she did. Lett learned to sew from her, then worked in a fabric store during high school so she could continue to sew her own clothes. She went on to college to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Textile and Clothing.

Lett was able to widen her interests as she and her husband raised their two daughters. She happily adopted a floor loom. Instead of a dining room table, there stood a very large loom. She travelled to Indiana for workshops, determined to learn how to weave.

Gardening came next on Lett's horizon of interests. Planning a garden considering color, texture, shape, and space while learning about plants was so rewarding to her.

When Lett was enrolling her two daughters in pottery class at the local Chicago Park District, she decided to give it a try herself. She found working on the wheel to be addictive but, eventually, drifted to sculpting with clay at The Palette and Chisel. The best challenge was capturing likeness in a portrait.

Over the years, Lett worked rehabbing houses as a decorator and dabbled in faux finishing. She eventually worked as a Montessori assistant before retiring just before COVID. She was in the sculpting studio at the Hyde Park Art Center at the time COVID started. The Center closed, but Hyde Park Art Center immediately started Zoom classes. Since Lett did not really know how to draw, Beginning Drawing was going to be the first class, only to find out that she could draw better than she thought. While sculpting portraits with clay, she learned what she needed to convey, now she needed to learn to use a new tool—the pencil. Encouraged, Lett took more classes. Bookmaking and watercolor painting classes ensued.

In 2020, Lett found and joined Town and Country Art League, which meets at the Biela Center in Crestwood. Its monthly meetings brought more exposure to artists, different mediums, workshops, and plein air opportunities.

Lett is still an avid gardener, potter, bookmaker, and watercolorist. She reflects that she never considered herself an artist all the while she was using the elements of art. She now realizes that she had been studying art all along. Some just go about it in different ways.



Fire Prevention Week Theme: Charge into Fire Safety October 5 through October 11

The National Fire Protection Association's Fire Prevention Week is observed every October to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871 and caused devastating damage to the city of Chicago. This year, Fire Prevention Week is observed October 5 through October 11. This is the 30th year that the Crestwood Fire Department has participated in educating residents and students about continued fire prevention and safety, in an effort to decrease damage and casualties caused by fire.

The theme this year is **Charge into Fire Safety: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home.**

Lithium-ion batteries have grown in popularity along with the devices that use them, such as smartphones, laptops, power tools, hoverboards, scooters, and electric vehicles. Here are three steps to follow to stay safe with lithium-ion batteries:

Buy Only Listed Products

When buying a product that uses a lithium-ion battery, look for a safety certification mark such as UL, ETL, or CSA. This means it meets important safety standards.

Charge Devices Safely

Always use the cords that came with the product to charge. Follow the instructions from the manufacturer. Buy new chargers from the manufacturer or one that the manufacturer has approved. Charge your device on a hard surface. Don't overcharge your device. Unplug it or remove the battery when it's fully charged.

Recycle Batteries Responsibly

Don't throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash or regular recycling bins because they could start a fire. Recycle your device or battery at a safe battery recycling location. Visit call2recycle.org to find a list of nearby recycling spots.

The Crestwood Fire Department will also be visiting the schools in town again this year for a fire safety refresher for our youngest residents. We had a great time last year educating students on how to stay safe during a scary situation.

And as always, this autumn when you turn your clocks back remember to change or test the batteries in your smoke detectors as well. Change your clocks, change your batteries.

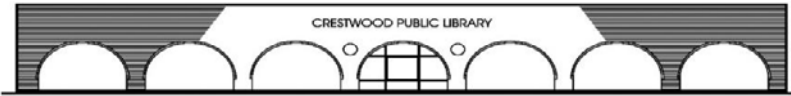

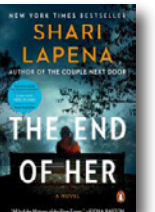

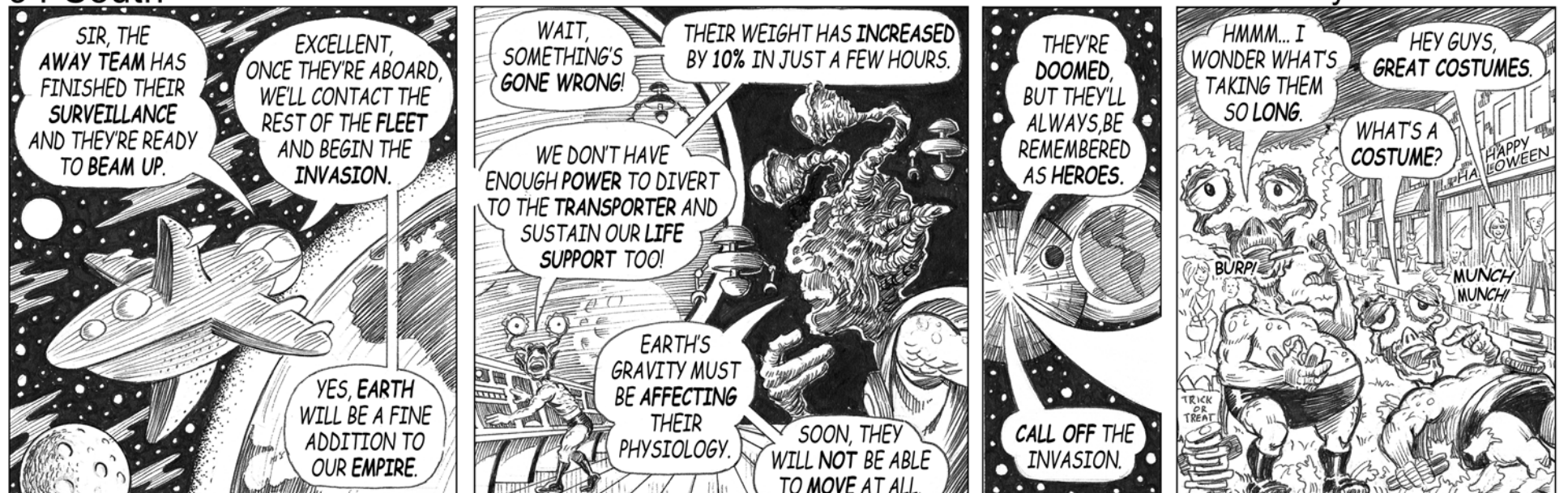
