CRESTWOOD FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE AND JULY, 2022 AS SUBMITTED BY CHIEF OF DEPARTMENT JON NEWTON.

The Crestwood Fire Department had 284 runs in the month of June, and 287 runs in the month of July, 2022. Total runs for the two month period of 571 as compared to 515 runs for the two month period in 2021.

The month of July saw several significant events as follows:

July 6th – Crestwood crews responded to 13506 S. Kenton Ave. for a fire in an occupied industrial suite. Crews encountered heavy fire conditions upon entry and a still and box alarm was requested by Captain Burke. There was no extension to any adjacent units due to all efforts from responding companies. The cause was determined to be accidental. The unit stored and distributed used appliances and apparently the fire started while the occupants were testing ovens.

July 17th – Crestwood Engine 2323 assisted Dolton for a fire in a glass factory at 13850 S. Cottage Grove Ave. Crew led out two hand lines and operated for approximately 1 ½ hrs.

July 21st – Crestwood Engine 2323 responded to Midlothian for a fire in a commercial building at 14426 S. Pulaski Rd. Crew assisted with general engine company work.

July 26th – Crestwood companies responded to 5324 W. 135th St. for a worker who fell into an excavation site. Crews found a worker who fell approximately 18 feet into the hole with significant life-threatening injuries. Crews immediately descended into the hole and administered Advanced Life Support care to the worker, while remaining crew worked to remove the worker from the hole after stabilization. Chief Newton responded to this call and took overall command. The performance of the members of the Crestwood Fire Department were exemplary, with little regard to personal safety, members descended into an extremely hazardous environment and performed with the utmost bravery. This run was far from routine, and Chief Newton has ordered a review of the incident to present commendations to the members.

July 27th – Crestwood truck 2314 and Duty Chief 2301 responded to Oak Forest for a fire in an occupied residential dwelling at 5424 La Palm Drive. Crew conducted horizontal ventilation and search and rescue on 2nd floor.

July 27th – Crestwood crews responded to 14019 S. Kilpatrick Ave. for a fire in a occupied residential multiple dwelling. Crews were assisted by Alsip, Midlothian, Palos Heights and Posen on the initial alarm. Crews found heavy fire in a second floor apartment. Crews led out two hand lines and conducted roof ventilation, as well as, search and rescue in apartments above the fire and adjacent to the fire. Crews worked for approximately 2 ½ hrs. No casualties reported and the cause of the fire was deemed accidental.

July 30th – Crestwood truck 2314 and Duty Chief 2301 responded to assist Robbins with a fire in an occupied dwelling. Crews threw multiple ground ladders.

Contract medic roll out update – As of July 12th the department has become fully staffed with the 8 firefighter/paramedic positions. This is the summit of the roll out period. After the 60 day period from the 12th of July, Paramedic Services of Illinois will be responsible to fill daily open positions on their own. Both PSI and our office agree the 4 shift system has stirred much interest in a tight workforce market. We believe this system is a game changer.

Manpower: Since the approval to hire EMT-B's, the department has hired 13 new members. The response to opening of EMT hires has been very good. We hope this continues to be the case in the future. Right now, since hiring these new members and with recent newly promoted individuals to offset command staff work, the department is in the process of normalizing.

New Apparatus Progress: In late July, Chief Engineer Hardwick and myself traveled to Clintonville, WI to conduct the final inspection of the two new Seagrave Pumpers. We were able to review the entire build and test both apparatus. In addition, Chief Engineer Hardwick was presented with one of the Engines (Engine 2303) which was named for him, as the longest serving member of the department (nearly 50 years). We expect to get the first rig in a couple of weeks with the other to follow later. Radios and equipment need to be installed before the rigs are put into service. We are also mounting bells on the new rigs that were on the original rigs Crestwood purchased in the 1960's.

GEMT Reimbursement Issue: Last year we entered this program called Ground Emergency Medical Transport reimbursement program. This program is meant to

reimburse fire department for the difference between what medicare pays and what a typical run costs the department. So far we have received over \$162,000. It seems that the State of Illinois is now expecting 50% of the GEMT reimbursements. So far no request has been made but we wanted the finance department made aware of the possible cost to the Village.

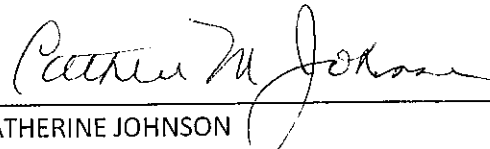
