### **CRESTWOOD FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT FOR JULY, 2020, AS SUBMITTED BY CHIEF NEWTON.**

Trustee Madlener read the monthly report for the Crestwood Fire Department highlighting the following:

Eight significant incidents for the month:

1. June, 14<sup>th</sup> – 15628 S. Lamon Ave., Oak Forest– Still alarm – General Truck work
2. June 16<sup>th</sup> – 12818 Hill Dr., Crestwood – Small Fire – extinguished w/hand pump.
3. June 17<sup>th</sup> – 13535 S. LeClaire Ave., Crestwood – kitchen/dining area fire, extinguished w/ hand pump – under investigation for arson.
4. June 19<sup>th</sup> – 13400 Oak Lane, Palos Heights – crew assisted in fire attack, Conducted general truck work, including ventilation.
5. June 23<sup>rd</sup> – 14830 S. Ketelaar Drive, Midlothian – multiple dwelling fire, roof ventilation, assumed interior operation and Chief 2300 assumed rapid Intervention team operations.
6. June 27<sup>th</sup> – 14500 S. McKinley St., Posen – still alarm for a fire, conducted roof ventilation and threw ground ladders.
7. June 28<sup>th</sup> – 4327 W. 148<sup>th</sup> St., Midlothian – still alarm for a fire in an occupied Dwelling, crew conducted roof ventilation and threw main and ground ladders.
8. July 8<sup>th</sup> – Cicero Ave. Bridge – “Person threatening to jump” from the Cicero Ave. bridge, crew discovered that the person was hanging from the I beam girders under the bridge. Crews utilized ropes and a personal floatation device to secure the person and coax him to safety. Transported safely to the hospital via a Crestwood ambulance.

process of renewing all of our property, casualty, cyber and professional liability insurance.

We will be resume safety committee meetings in August.

We are at a hold with the union negotiations with ICOPS for our part-time Police Officers. The members haven't heard from ICOPS since November. We have submitted our last proposal.

Our new software system BS&A is going along. We still haven't gone live with payroll or HR but a number of other modules are up and running.

HR is working with the Police Chief along with the Police Commission on the process of hiring lateral officers. We need to hire some experienced officers, as we discussed before. We currently have 13 full-time and 31 part-time officers. 1 full time officer is on administrative leave, 1 officer is on workman's comp with a return to work date of no earlier than six months from now. We have 2 part-time officers on workman's comp, as well.

Hometown Hero's banners are currently hanging on Cicero. We will be placing a second order shortly.

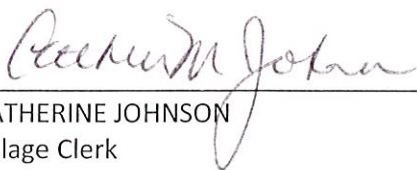

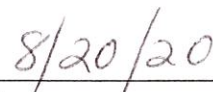
